



Relative Tuning

Whenever a pitch pipe, piano or another tuned ukulele is not available to you for tuning, the relative tuning method can be used. This method will allow the uke to be in tune with itself, but not necessarily in tune with any other instrument.

1. Turn the tuning peg of the 1st string (A) until it is fairly tight and produces a high tone
2. Press the 5th fret of the 2nd string (E) and tune to equal the pitch of the 1st string (A).
3. Press the 4th fret of the 3rd string (C) and tune to equal the pitch of the 2nd string (E).
4. Press the 2nd fret of the 4th string (G) and tune to equal the pitch of the 1st string (A).

Ukulele Fingering

If you see the sharp symbol #, it means to *raise* the pitch one fret higher. The flat symbol b means to *lower* the pitch one fret back.



Ukulele Chords

The chord fingerings are only suggestive, you may find other fingerings that are easier.
