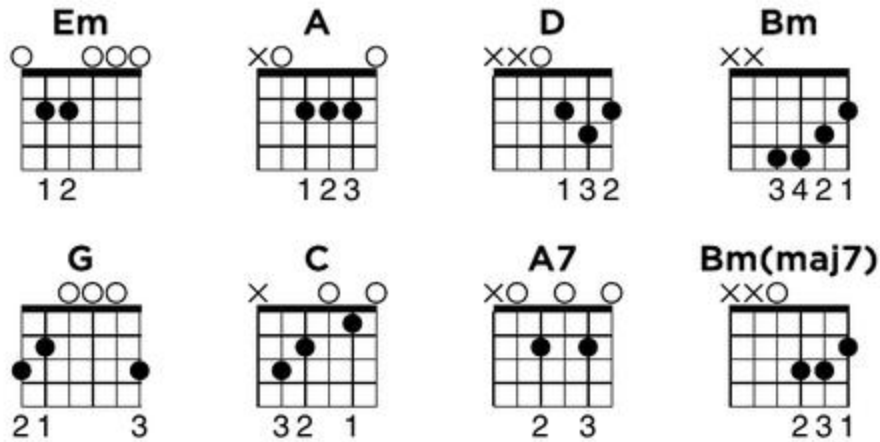


All My Loving

VERSE 1

Moderately fast

Close your eyes **Em** and I'll kiss **A** you, tomorrow I'll miss **D** you. **Bm**

G Remember I'll always be true. **Em** **C** **A7**

And then while I'm away, **Em** I'll write home every day, **A** **D** **Bm**

G and I'll send all my loving to you. **A** **D**

VERSE 2

I'll pretend **Em** that I'm kiss - ing the lips I am miss - ing, **A** **D** **Bm**

G and hope that my dreams will come true. **Em** **C** **A7**

And then while I'm away, I'll write home every day, **Em** **A** **D** **Bm**

G and I'll send all my loving to you. **A** **D**

BRIDGE

Bm All my lovin', I **Bm(maj7)** will send to you. **D**

Bm All my lovin', dar - lin', I'll be true. **Bm(maj7)** **D**

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GUITAR NOTATION LEGEND

Chord Diagrams

CHORD DIAGRAMS graphically represent the guitar fretboard to show correct chord fingerings.

- The letter above the diagram tells the name of the chord.
- The top, bold horizontal line represents the nut of the guitar. Each thin horizontal line represents a fret. Each vertical line represents a string; the low E string is on the far left and the high E string is on the far right.
- A dot shows where to put your fret-hand finger and the number at the bottom of the diagram tells which finger to use.
- The "O" above the string means play it open, while an "X" means don't play the string.



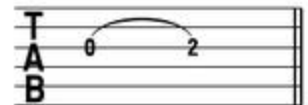
Tablature

TABLATURE graphically represents the guitar fingerboard. Each horizontal line represents a string, and each number represents a fret.

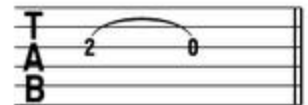


Definitions for Special Guitar Notation

HAMMER-ON: Strike the first (lower) note with one finger, then sound the higher note (on the same string) with another finger by fretting it without picking.



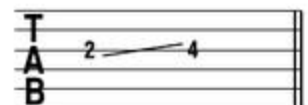
PULL-OFF: Place both fingers on the notes to be sounded. Strike the first note and without picking, pull the finger off to sound the second (lower) note.



LEGATO SLIDE: Strike the first note and then slide the same fret-hand finger up or down to the second note. The second note is not struck.



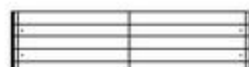
SHIFT SLIDE: Same as legato slide, except the second note is struck.
